## Tribal Homekey+

An Overview of California HCD Funding Programs

#### **Program Goals and Funding**

- Tribal Homekey+ builds on the previous Homekey Tribal program with a focus on behavioral health and supportive services
- \$121 million is available through non-competitive, overthe-counter grants

#### Eligibility

- Funding for permanent supportive housing for households
  - Experiencing or at-risk of homelessness and
  - Having a behavioral health challenge and
  - With incomes at or below 60% of area median
- Tribal entities may apply, including FRT, TDHEs, and California Tribes

#### Things to Know

- Requires a limited waiver of sovereign immunity
- Requires a pre-application meeting with program staff
- Applicable laws and exemptions for tribes depend on project location, funding sources, and Tribal Law

### **Tribal HHAP**

An Overview of California HCD Funding Programs

#### **Program Goals and Funding**

- The Tribal Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention Program Provides flexible funding to support culturally responsive interventions and prevent and address homelessness within Tribal communities
- \$28.5 million available in Round 4
- Previously administered by California Interagency Council on Homelessness

#### Eligibility

- Federally Recognized Tribes in California
- All applicants who submit a complete application will receive funds
- Funds can be used for permanent housing solutions, homelessness prevention, interim housing solutions, and nonhousing solutions (including services)

#### Things to Know

- If the total requested funds exceed the amount available: an allocation methodology will be used to determine each applicant's proportionate share of need relative to all application submissions
- Each applicant is assigned a technical assistance provider to help with everything from the application to grant reporting
- Round 4 Draft NOFA expected to be released in the coming weeks

## **Tribal Multifamily Finance Super NOFA**

An Overview of California HCD Funding Programs

#### **Program Goals and Funding**

- Streamlines two programs into one application: Multifamily Housing Program (MHP) and Infill Infrastructure Grant Program (IIG)
- MHP (\$30 million) provides loans to assist new construction, rehabilitation, and conversion of permanent and transitional rental housing for lower income households
- IIG (\$24 million) provides grants for infrastructure improvements necessary for specific residential or mixed-use infill projects

#### Eligibility

- Tribal entities in California with *experience* and *ability* to develop, own, and operate affordable housing
- Various affordability limits and terms, project site qualification

#### Things to Know

- Maximum MHP award is \$8 million
  - Affordability term is 55-years, or 50-years on trust land
- IIG grant amounts are calculated using a per-unit formula

## Additional State Funding Programs

An Overview of California HCD Funding Programs

#### **CalHome Tribal**

- \$18 million in funds for loans and grants for homeownership development projects, mortgage assistance, and other programs to promote homeownership
- Applications closed in March but may be re-opening

#### **HOME Investment Partnerships**

- \$35 million total NOFA with a \$7 million tribal target
  - Maximum award is \$4.5 million
- California Tribes eligible for project and program activities, from rental housing construction to tenantbased rental assistance

## Local Housing Trust Fund

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#### **Goal of the Program**

- Must be awarded to entity with a new or existing Housing Trust Fund
- Provides dollar-for-dollar match funds to be used by Grantee to provide construction loans and/or deferred payment permanent financing loans at simple interest rates of no higher than 3 percent per annum, for payment of predevelopment costs, acquisition, construction, or rehabilitation of Eligible Projects
- Up to 20% of project costs can support moderate income households (>120% AMI); minimum of 30% toward extremely low-income (>50% AMI). All program funds with dedicated sources of funding are eligible for a match (not otherwise restricted like ICDBG and IHBG)

#### **Program Funding**

- Last available NOFA in July 2024

#### **Eligibility Guidelines:**

- Funds shall be used to make construction loans and/or permanent financing loans to pay for:
  - predevelopment costs,
  - acquisition costs, and
  - other costs associated with development or rehabilitation of: 1) Affordable rental housing projects, 2) Emergency Shelters, 3) Permanent Supportive Housing, 4) Transitional Housing, and 5) Affordable homebuyer/homeowner projects, including assistance to income-eligible households to purchase for-sale units.
  - Funds may also be used for the construction, conversion, repair, reconstruction, or rehabilitation of Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) or Junior Accessory Dwelling Units (JADUs).

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### Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities

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#### **Goal of the Program**

- In partnership with the Strategic Growth Council (SGC), HCD is pleased to announce the release of the Round 9 <u>Notice of Funding Availability</u> [hcd.ca.gov] (NOFA) for approximately \$775 million in funds available under the Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC) Program.
- The AHSC Program is administered by SGC. The Department will implement the transportation, housing, and infrastructure components of the Program. The Program provides loans and grants to eligible Applicants for Projects that achieve GHG emissions reductions to benefit all Californians, especially Disadvantaged Communities, Low-Income Communities, and Low-Income Households throughout California. The Program can fund the capital and eligible program costs of qualified projects for:
  - Affordable Housing Development (AHD)
  - Housing Related Infrastructure (HRI)
  - Sustainable Transportation Infrastructure (STI)
  - Community Education and Other Program Costs (PGM)

#### Timeline

• The <u>HCD AHSC Application Portal [uwedhmtab.cc.rs6.net]</u> is open. Applicants must upload application materials electronically via AHSC portal no later than: **4:00 p.m. PST on May 28, 2025** 

#### **Tribal Guidelines:**

 Tribes and tribal entities are eligible to apply for AHSC. New this Round, AHSC has a funding goal of \$50 million for tribal entities and reduced minimum award amount. This tribal entity goal is equivalent to the maximum award for one project. The minimum award for tribal applicants is \$1 million. More information on the tribal entity goal and tribal applicants can be found in Sections 103 and 112 of the <u>AHSC</u> guidelines [sgc.ca.gov].
